- Berea College Crafts is excited to introduce the AIR Institute of Berea College. AIR empowers artists' entrepreneurial spirit by providing workshops, seminars, and online tools. Over the last several years, the AIR Institute has had a positive impact both nationally and regionally, and we are glad that their permanent home will now be with the Crafts Program at Berea College.

Weaving

IN THE EARLY 1890s, Berea College President William G. Frost was astounded by 'kivers', woven coverlets produced in Appalachia mountain homes. He established Berea's "Fireside Industries" as a way to preserve traditional Appalachian crafts and to provide parents a currency with which they could pay for their children's education.

Starting in 1896, after each year's commencement ceremony, woven goods were sold on campus at Homespun Fairs. These woven items proved so popular that looms were moved onto campus so students could learn weaving. Through its support of traditional mountain arts, Berea College became a leader of the American Arts and Crafts movement and the Appalachian Craft Revival.

Using the finest materials, Berea student weavers still maintain time-honored hand loom and fly-shuttle weaving techniques. Though these traditional methods of weaving are the principal methods of production, computer-aided looms now allow students to develop complicated and sophisticated new patterns for special orders and commissions.

Berea Forest Trail Rug

A well-loved mountain trail in Berea was the inspiration for this rug. The shades of green evident in the spring and summer foliage, the brown and rust colors on the trail surface and fall leaves, all contrast with the blue-gray hues of the rock faces. In the early 1900s, the Wood Studio started to produce wooden puzzles and games, benches and stools, candleholders, and the famed "Berea Basket". Today, we are proud to offer a large collection of handcrafted wooden items for the home and for fun—from furniture to checkers. Berea College students assure that each piece is of the highest quality, down to the last round of finish and hand sanding.

Our Wood Studio products are made exclusively from Appalachian hardwoods, including cherry, walnut, maple, and poplar. All wood is harvested responsibly to minimize our impact on soil and water resources. Our use of regional wood reduces transportation costs and stimulates local economies in Appalachia.





IN 1970, BEREA COLLEGE CRAFTS initiated the Ceramics

Apprenticeship Program. Students work under the guidance of master potters to produce an array of individual works of art.

In the Ceramics Studio, work provides students a thorough understanding of traditional throwing, as well as inspiring innovation and individual expression.

All of our ceramics are hand-thrown, hand-glazed and kiln-fired to 2300°. Our pieces are stoneware or porcelain and do not contain any toxic materials. All items are dishwasher safe and oven safe to 350°. Items may be used in the microwave, but heating times should be limited to no more than four minutes. These items should not be used on stovetop burners and care should be taken to avoid extreme temperature changes. Our ceramics are crafted with care, and when used with care, they will last a lifetime.

Each ceramic piece we make is one-of-a-kind with no two pieces being exactly alike.

The creative spirit of our Ceramics students is evident in these unique mugs. No two will be quite alike and all are signed by the student maker. All glazes and mugs are food, dishwasher and microwave safe.

BROOM MAKING is a physically demanding discipline. Thanks to the dedication of our students and Berea College's long history mastering dyeing techniques and broom making processes, we are able to produce the finest handcrafted brooms available.

Since 1920, our students have produced a wide range of brooms. From brooms especially designed for your fireplace to limited edition heirlooms, each broom will be cherished and prized for its superior quality and workmanship.

Each broom is made from sustainable, natural materials and colored with dyes used in the floral industry. Smooth handles are made from reclaimed waste wood from the U.S. furniture industry. Rustic handles are hand cut saplings, selectively harvested in an eco-conscious method that prevents overcrowding and promotes re-growth. And each broom is constructed from organic broomcorn—an upright grass similar to sugar cane. Growing upwards of 15-feet tall, each plant produces a single upright tassel at the top. A typical full size kitchen broom contains 30 to 50 broomcorn plants.



The Future of Craft

In July 2016, Berea College acquired the intellectual property of the Arts Incubator of the Rockies, or AIR. The programs, now known as the AIR Institute of Berea College, has relocated from Colorado and become part of the Berea College Crafts Program.

The AIR Institute programs serve communities with creativity-focused community and economic development workshops and programs. Using cross-sector collaboration, AIR serves artists, business people, educators, and the community together. AIR Institute programs teach design thinking, business planning, and entrepreneurial initiative while incorporating industry-stimulating business development strategies and tactics.

Berea College will be offering AIR programs throughout the United States, with an initial focus on Appalachia and the Intermountain West regions. "The AIR programs build on the Berea College tradition of serving artists, expanding financial opportunities for Appalachia, and promoting arts, crafts, and creative business practices," said Tim Glotzbach, Director of Berea College Crafts. "The programs are a natural extension of the original Fireside Industries programs instituted by Berea's third president, William Goodell Frost in the late 1800s. Students and others in our region will now be able to access innovative programs that will help them make a financially sustainable living as artists, creatives, and social entrepreneurs," said Glotzbach.

Since its inception in 2012, AIR programs have supported the efforts of more than 500 artists, creatives, business owners, educators, and community leaders from more than a dozen states.

GROWING UP IN NORTHERN ALABAMA,

Iliana Lomeli's childhood wasn't always easy. The daughter of immigrants from Michoacan, Mexico, she remembers some tough times. "There weren't many Hispanic families in Northern Alabama and I remember a lot of racism. It was hard for my parents because they were very involved with my education, but the language barrier made communication with my teachers difficult, especially when I was little."

Family is very important to Iliana and it was her family that encouraged her to come to Berea College. "I was a little scared to be that far from home. I had never been further north than Tennessee before I came to Berea," she says laughing.

Her strong family ties are what have pushed Iliana to this point. The senior, elementary education major wants to go home to Northern Alabama following graduation and help kids that are in the situation she found herself in as a child. "The Hispanic population has grown significantly, and there is a great need for bilingual teachers. I want to bridge the gap for the kids who are like I was growing up. They have parents who want to be involved but the language barrier prevents them from doing so."

Iliana has been a Weaver in Berea College Crafts for three of her four years on campus. She loves how the work gives her a time to step away from the fast pace of her studies and de-stress. She also loves how working in Weaving allows her to be innovative. Iliana was essential to developing the new broom corn runner that is being debuted in the catalog this year and she is currently teaching other weavers how to create it.
